John 19

Jesus is crucified on the cross for those He came to save. Are you willing to suffer in His Name to show His love to others?

Observation: What does it say?

1. Read John 19. Mark: *God/pronouns, Jesus/King of the Jews/Son of God/pronouns, and the phrase "to fulfill the Scripture."*
2. What do the soldiers do with His clothing? Read Psalm 22:18.
3. What do the soldiers give Jesus to drink? Read Psalm 69:21.
4. What are the soldiers doing to the mens' legs? What happens to Jesus's legs? Read Psalm 34:20.
5. What do they do to His side? Read Zechariah 12:10 and Revelation 1:7.

Interpretation: What does the author mean?

6. Why did Pilate "make efforts to release" Jesus? What did the Jews say about that?
7. Why did Jesus said to His mother, "Woman, behold, your son" and to John, "Behold, your mother?"

8. In Jn 19:35, John is writing to *you*. What does He say about what He saw and why He wrote it down?

9. Who is Joseph of Arimathea and what role did he play?

10. Read John 3 and learn about Nicodemus. Why do you think he came to help at the end?

11. Write a theme for this chapter and add it to the chart on page 1756.

Application: therefore, what shall I do?

12. What do you think Jesus meant when He said, “It is finished” in verse 30?
How does this make a difference in your life?

13. Why do you think John included the brutal details of Jesus’ death? Why is it important to know that He really died? How would you explain this to someone else who might say that He was really just “passed out?”
